Movers Flock to Miami


- Miami is the most popular migration destination of all the major U.S. metros (January 2022), unchanged from the third and fourth quarters of 2021.
- Net inflow into Miami has doubled since this time last year, with New York as the numberone place of origin for those moving to the area.





MIAMI: CAPITAL, COMPANIES & TALENT

- \$5.33B invested in South Florida startups and late-stage companies across 285 deals (2021).
 - 9 of top 20 deals were new-tomarkets – Moonpay, Pipe, 8sleep, OpenStore
 - 70% early stage –Angel, Seed, Series A
- South Florida & State investment 2 x 2020
 - South Florida represents 75% of value and 55% of deals





MIAMI: CAPITAL, COMPANIES & TALENT

- Fintech: 62 deals totaling \$2.28B
 - 20 x 2020; 40%+ total VC raise
 - MoonPay, Pipe, Healthcare.com
- Health Tech: 52 deals totaling \$1.1B
 - 3 x 2020; 20%+ total VC raise
 - Papa, Heru, ExumaBiotech
- Crypto & Blockchain: 23 deals totaling \$859
 - 16% of total VC raise in Web3 startups
 - US Bitcoin Corp, Securitize, Moonpay


