


**Ranking of Top World Airport in International Passengers and Freight**

International Freight (in millions of Metric Tonnes)














#### MIA Pharma 2021:

- Record year for total volume of pharmaceutical trade and for pharmaceutical Exports (18,355 metric tons)/ Exports to LaTam – 78%
- > 4<sup>th</sup> consecutive year of over 15 million Kg of pharmaceutical cargo
- Major airport hub for COVID-19 vaccine distribution

MIA FTZ Magnet Site was approved on Feb 7, 2018

Magnet Site Area includes all **3,248 acres of the airport** (1,314 hectares).

FTZs allow manufacturing, mixing of foreign/domestic merchandise, kitting and longterm storage.

A Vertically Integrated Cargo Community, VICC® is poised to transform the MIA cargo market.

VICC will provide the annual capacity to serve up to 4.5m metric tons of air cargo annually once fully completed.

A 1.7m square foot innovative cargo powerhouse, VICC incorporates all aspects of cargo throughput functionalities under one roof.



VICC will multiply MIA's cargo capacity by at least 2x and will be the most efficient, highly automated shipper and consumer friendly cargo community in the world.

VICC will create approx. 8,000 high-paying cargo jobs & will support employees with retail, hospitality, healthcare, and daycare facilities.







VICC expands modern cargo operational capacity with the ability to service up to 4.5m metric tons of cargo and 12 Category VI Aircraft Parking Positions.

truck dwell time, with an ample truck queue, resulting in a 50 percent truck trip reduction




